Among many exciting developments during 2022, GUE was excited to launch a new and expansive Project Diver curriculum, including a core module and an apprentice project across three levels (Project Diver 1, 2, and 3) which vary according to the depth of the project being conducted. Meanwhile, the core module develops knowledge through lectures and working groups as well as in-water working sessions, covering a review of and practice with a range of project-based skills and resources. The two core modules were taught in Dubai and Florida and received strong praise from the attendees, and a beta apprentice technical project was conducted in Ireland. Both Cave 3 and Tech 3 programs were announced and formalized in 2022, with the first Cave 3 conducted in December and

These Level 3 programs are designed around deep, goal-oriented diving up to 120 m. These deep programs, and most especially in tandem with our Project Diver curriculum, are an important asset for our wide range of global diving projects, providing our community with critical skills and experience planning and executing complex projects across the range of depths commonly encountered by our teams.

ne development that comes from the removal of most Covidera restrictions is the resurgence of our many global diving projects. Many intrepid divers braved the challenges during the height of the pandemic, but more and more of our communities are now able to properly organize the amazing projects that have been at the heart of GUE since inception.
